
The handover began with an address by MEC Makamu who expressed his joy over Mayor Minah Bahula's work and encouraged her to do well and continue the good work she has started. He also pledged the support of the District and the local municipality in ensuring that the good service delivery track record of Makhuduthamaga is supported and enhanced.

"Gathering here today we are witnessing the realisation of the promise of The Freedom Charter which was adopted in 1955. One thing that the Freedom Charter says and that we are witnessing today is that there shall be housing, security and comfort for all. We also see to it that people must choose where they



want to stay. People must not be compelled to live in Polokwane because there are better roads, our people must stay wherever they want to stay and still enjoy the comfort by allowing the services to come where they are" said MEC Makamu Just like MEC Makamu the recipient of the fully furnished new house Mrs Mogashoa said in her response that she remains eternally grateful to Mulalo Business Enterprise for offering to build the house when they heard of the Mogashoa's plight.

In the words of Mayor Minah Bahula of Makhuduthamaga the situation at Mogashoa household before the building of the new house was not bearable and it took away their human dignity to live in those kinds of conditions. Mayor Bahula added that they will continue to invite MEC Makamu and Executive Mayor Ramaila to come and open more new houses of a similar fashion as long as there are still reservoirs of com-



munity spirit shown by the community of Mogashoa, Mme Hunadi Matlala who escalated the Mogashoa's plight and business people like Mulalo Business Enterprise who are willing to lend a hand when the need arise. Mayor Bahula concluded by thanking the construction team of Mulalo Business Enterprise for working around the clock to ensure that the house is opened during Women's Month because the municipality holds a strong view that the intervention on Mme Mogashoa's situation is about women's dignity signified by women's month.



Budgeting together with communities

or iving communities a voice in the budget planning process took place during the IDP/ Budget Consultations that took place in April in line with the Integrated Development Planning cycle. In order for the people of Makhuduthamaga to factually monitor and track the performance of the municipality the State of the Municipality Address (SOMA) and now the Budget Speech tabling have joined a basket of platforms through which the people of Makhuduthamaga are informed, and taken into confidence about the workings of the municipality.

As such the Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality Budget Speech and Adoption of IDP Session was held on 29 May 2019 in Marulaneng Village (Ward 23) of the Municipality. In her address to hundreds of residents of Makhuduthamaga from all 31 wards Honourable Mayor Her Worship Cllr Minah Bahula began by thanking the residents of the municipality for joining millions of South Africans in defending our country's hard earned democracy by going all out and cast their votes to elect government of their choice, and also to commend the IEC for once again delivering credible, free and fair 2019 national and provincial elections.

"Hon Speaker let me once again take this opportunity to congratulate the governing party the ANC for a decisive victory during these elections. I have strong believe that our elected leaders have the capacity to deliver the manifesto of the party to continue and ensure the trust that our people have in our government of delivering basic ser-

vices" said Mayor Bahula. Mayor Bahula pronounced that the municipality has allocated R6.5m to ensure inclusive economic and growth and job creation. Expenditure will be in a form of coordinating support for SMMEs to ensure sustainability. This includes hawkers, manufacturing, and agriculture. We also allocate R1m for land acquisition over the 2019/20 period.

Makhuduthamaga is known for delivery of municipal roads networks that connect communities and make economic sense. To continue with this legacy Mayor Bahula declared an injection of R84m on construction of our strategic roads infrastructure and R8.8m allocated to fill all critical permanent posts including our general workers over the MTREF period. Mayor Bahula raised the bar in terms of the municipality's support for education enrichment initiatives by allocating R4m for the Mayoral Annual Cluster Career Expos because education remains fundamental and very close to our hearts and key to government's economic growth pathways. Jerking up career paths for young people, the municipality will again allocate R4.1m for two years internship program and the annual training programs for municipal staff, ward committees and honourale Councillors.

"We have also budgeted R1.3m to promote transparency and to ensure compliance with the Supply Chain Management systems and R2.7m is allocated for internal auditing functions over MTREF period" pointed Mayor Bahula. In summing up the budget Mayor Bahula said a projected

total revenue budget to the amount of R427m for 2019/20 budget year, R451m and R480m for 2020/21 and 2021/22 Financial Years respectively. And that the total revenue budget for 2019/20 consists of R333m from our national government grants and R94m from our own sources of revenue. She also gave a detailed breakdown of the budget analysis which indicate that total national transfers and grants for 2019/2020 are made up of R268m from our equitable share, R1.8m for Finance Management Grant, R62m for MIG grant and R1m for EPWP. Again R94m from our revenue sources is made up of R43m from property rates, R7m from interests on investment, R36m from interests on outstanding accounts, R9m from agency services, R625k from our own traffic fines and R685k from other revenue.

This imply that the total annual expenditure to the amount of R437m for 2019/2020 Financial Years. Expenditure for 2 outer years is R450m and R480m for 2020/2021 and 2021/2022 Financial Years respectively, while the 2019/2020 expenditure is made up of R337m for operational expenditure and R90m for capital expenditure. "We appropriated a total R90m for capital expenditure budget to be implemented in 2019/2020 budget year. We tried our level best to cover as many wards as possible with limited Financial sources available to ensure that service delivery is spread equally to all wards.R1m is allocated to purchase office furniture and equipment, R32m for purchase of Information Technology equipment and R1.3m for traffic management equipment" concluded Bahula to a deafening echo of ululations and applauses.







Roads that withstand flooding

that swept away some of the roads in Makhuduthamaga in December 2018 has led to improved and proactive approach on managing storm water. This was confirmed by Mayor of Makhuduthamaga as she studied the specifications for each road infrastructure construction project implemented in Makhuduthamaga, particularly municipal access roads. Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality continues with its streak of successful road infrastructure proj-

ects that shape the community landscape. Residents of Makhutšo and Ga-Mampane were enjoined with this network of navigable residential areas that Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality has since created through record breaking and award-winning implementation of Municipal Infrastructure Grant (MIG). Just a stone throw away from Mampane Access Road Phase 4 where construction has started, the municipality is finalising the planning and budgeting phases of the roads to enliven community life and travel experience in Makgwabe to Mphane through the implementation of Phase 2. This road project will also be funded through the MIG grant, and upon its completion there will be a safe tar of 10 km. "The community is very confident in our local government; the delivery of this road has instilled a spirit of social cohesion and a happy community. We really thank the Mayor of Makhuduthamaga for making sure that the road connects our two villages which also encouraged transpor-

tation to be accessible", said the Project CLO, Andronica Maseema. Talking of community life and travel experience the road will help to connect institutions like Makgwabe Pri-Makgwabe Premary School, School, Makgwabe Community Hall, Maphadime Secondary School, and religious institutions such as the ZCC Church and New Generation Church among others. The excitement about these roads project has been expressed by communities, particularly participants of the Community Works Programme (CWP) which is active and continues to take care of other community infrastructure including the road.

According to the Mayor of Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality Cllr Minah Bahula the appointment letter was issued to the service provider for professional services related to the Ga-Mampane Access Road Phase 4. Mayor Bahula explained that the Phase 4 construction includes a 5.28 km mileage covering the Ga-Mampane area through the access road from gravel to Asphalt surface, construction of 1.0 km of open side drains, 280m of drainage culvert structures.

And that the project is located in Ga-Mampane Township which is about 43 km North West from Jane Furse town of Makhuduthamaga Municipality within the Sekhukhune District Municipality. Emphasis has been put on planning the roads to withstand flash floods.





Blanket relief on flick

It might look like a small gesture from a distance, be sure to change your mind about it when you see elderly beneficiaries lighting up their faces as they get hold of a brand new blanket. The signature campaign of donating blankets was adopted a few years ago and it's a thread that meaningfully connect the people of Makhuduthamaga with their municipality.

Koko Bolao Phala of Maila-Segolo in Ward 23 explained how difficult it is for her to keep warm in winter because her old age pension money does not take her far because of the cost of basic food supplies such as maize meal.

"My six grandchildren have grown up now and they each want a comfortable blanket. Even when I try my best to buy the blankets bit by bit they still need a new blanket when they pass matric for further studies. The blanket donated by our Mayor is going to help a lot and we really bless her good heart for thinking about us" said Koko Bolao.

She is not alone vibrant group of older persons from the neighbouring Marulaneng village share their experiences on a happier note too, they welcome the relief because it means less pressure on their pockets and that they can direct the funds to other household items. This noble campaign continued on a high note on 16 May 2019 at Ga-Moretsele and Makgane where hundreds of elders continue to benefit through this initiative which has covered most parts of the 31 wards of the municipality.

Tribute to MmaKgoši Malekutu Sekwati

onourale Minah Bahula joined hundreds of mourners to bid farewell to the late MmaKgoshi Lekgolane Malekutu Sekwati, mother of His Majesty Kgoshi Mampuru Billy Mampuru at Mamone Moshate on 10 August 2019. The ceremony was attended by among others MEC Namane Dickson Masemola, spiritual leaders and a range of dignitaries from the national, provincial and local sphere of government including traditional leadership structures, and royal majesties and highnesses. The late MmaKgoshi Lekgolane Malekutu Sekwati (Moshop-

yadi a Phaahle a Ngwato a Bauba) was born at Magakala, Moshate on 04 October 1935. She is the first-born daughter of the late Chief Ntwampe and Candle wife Diphala Ntwampe, born with late Chief Lawrence Legadimane Ntwampe and younger Sister Manyaku Maria Thulare.

The late MmaKgoshi Lekgolane Malekutu Sekwati was married as a candle wife of the Pedi Mamone Tribe in 1964. She beared an heir to the throne known as Kgoshi Mampuru III. Her other Children are Prince Seraki Mampuru; Prince Ntwampe;

Princess Matobole Lillian; Prince Mampuru Nicholas; Prince Sekhukhune Kennedy and Prince Phathudi Collet. Her grand Children are Malekutu Tšhegofatšo; Tokologo Johanna Lekgolane; Ntwampe Neo; Malekutu Mokgethi; Manyaku Mmabatho Maria; Seraki Theophillus; Mackeillan; Lawrence Legadimane; Motubatse Thapelo; Kgoputjo Mokete and Tšhegofatšo Arabella Diphala.

She was a selfless leader, advisor, negotiator and had pragmatic character in all aspects. She assisted a lot of academics in their thesis including well known Prof Barbara Oomen from University of Leiden in Holland; D.M Kgobe well known author of that time, the list is endless. She was appointed as Kgoshigadi of Bapedi Ba Mamone Tribe on 25th July 1978 and ruled the community until she handed over the powers and the title to the successor Kgoshi Mampuru Billy Mampuru in a coronation ceremony held on 19 December 1998. She was consulted and took



part in advising the recruits in 1979, also when the late Frisco Phala came to recruit further and strengthening the base which was based at Mamone Maroteng Royal Palace.

From 1978 she served as Member of the Legislative Assembly under the leadership of the late Chief Minister Cedrick Phatudi and another term under the leadership of the late Chief Minister Mogoboya Nelson Ramodike. She served as ex officio in negotiations and preparation for interim council members of Ngwaritsi Transitional Local Government. In 1997, first Mayor the late Kgaola Abram Mafiri was appointed.

During her life time, she had ever flourishing desire for education and prosperity. The following schools were built: Matšhumane Secondary school – Glen Cowie Village; Matobole Primary school; Ngwanatshwaane High school; Tenyane High school; Makubarate Primary school; Marotobale Primary school and Motlokwe Primary school. The following were initiated during her tenure and in her influence: Community based projects; Hlatlolanang Health & Nu-




trition Centre: Nebo Grain Board: Pedi Mamone Tribal Offices; Health Care Facility; and New Jane Furse Hospital as well as Government facilities such as Makhuduthamaga local government offices, Jane Furse industrial units, Mamone Clinic, Old Jane Furse police station, Jane Furse RDP and 1997 tribal resolution that seeks to relocate regional offices from Lebowakgomo to Jane-Furse. Commercial developments such as Jane Furse plaza are some of her indelible legacies. She claimed the farms in 1995 in which Bapedi ba Mamone tribe has jurisdiction. She

initiated the idea of commemorating the fallen hero Kgoshi Mampuru II, who was executed in public by the Boer government at Pretoria Central Prison in 1883. Today the Commemoration ceremony of Kgoshi Mampuru is regarded as one of the biggest in South Africa. The late MmaKgoshi Lekgolane Malekutu Sekwati passed on Thursday 11 July 2019 at Bapedi Ba Mamone Royal Palace and has been laid to rest at the Royal Kraal Cemetery. Robala Ka Khutšo "Moshopjadi A Phaahle A Ngwato A Bauba".

Persistent road death do not only strike fear in the hearts of communities and households, the effects and scars of such losses cut too deep into the emotions, family stability and even the economy" Mayor Minah Bahula said these solemn words in front of hundreds of mourners attending the joint mass funeral at Mogaladi Village in June 2019.

The funeral service was attended by many dignitaries such as Limpopo MEC for Transport and Community Safety, Namane Masemola who paid their last respects to the last of the seven who burnt to death in a car crash. The accident, which claimed seven lives, occurred in April this year between Mamphokgo and Mmakgatle villages in within the Ephraim Mogale Local Municipality.

According to the department of transport the last of the seven victims remained unidentifiable over time, owing to the DNA match challenges due to the extent to which his remains were burnt. The department said MEC Masemola had to talk to the family and friends to finally bury his remains and get closure. According to witnesses the accident happened when an Avis Rental car missed its designated lane veering off to face oncoming traffic resulting in a head-on collision with a Ford Ranger LDV - causing both vehicles to catch fire. Mayor Minah Bahula together with MEC Masemola told the mourners that Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality and the Department will offer all the possible support, and referrals for further support to the affected families.

Mayor Minah Bahula together with Deputy Minister Joe Phaahla, MEC Dickson Masemola, Kgoshi Phaahla attended another mass funeral of six (6) people at Ga-Phaahla Village, who perished in a motor crash on the R579 road next to Mogorwane/ Ga-Moloi. Mayor Bahula delivered her words of condolences to the families and friends of the victims of the horrible accident and further called upon road users to exercise extra caution on the roads across the municipality and abroad.





Economy unlocked at the LED Summit

Ayor of Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality Cllr Minah Bahula rallied stakeholders from all parts of Makhuduthamaa to connect, exchange and share ideas on the rekindling of the municipality's economy under the banner of Makhuduthamaga Economic Summit. Zai OAT Hotel in Jane Furse was the ideal venue to convene multitudes of delegates representing small businesses (SMMEs) and cooperatives of Makhuduthamaga to engage through dialogue and an open networking environment. The hotel was not the only local business that benefited from the Makhuduthamaga Economic Summit held on 06 June 2019, the entire value chain included supply of items, and transport of guests and delegates


was planned to bring the local economy to life. In her opening address Honourale Mayor of Makhuduthamaga Cllr Minah Bahula told the delegates that the summit was called to ensure continued growth of local economy, job creation and social upliftment of the people of Makhuduthamaga. She said her municipality especially welcome the summit because it's a platform to create a better environment for small businesses and enterprises to thrive other in domestic and international markets. "In terms of building the local economy we know for a fact that we have already laid some foundations for progress and transformation hence our local businesses are a priority in terms of supply of goods and services" explained the Mayor Bahula. In

giving an overview of the performance of the local economy across all economic sectors, particularly tourism, agriculture and mining where the Makhuduthamaga has a comparative advantage Mayor Bahula said the summit comes at a time when the country and the district are experiencing economic contraction. She called upon local businesses and the communities to work towards addressing the challenge of contraction and garner creative ways to bolster investor attractiveness of the municipality's economy. "Taking place in the youth month of June, this summit is one of the motivations to continue to intervene and ensure young people are well equipped to conceptualise, initiate and operate successful businesses" said Mayor Bahula.

He added that as different stakeholders have been working during commissions, and they have paid a detailed attention to issues such as informal trading and land use. Among the speakers that presented to the







summit are presenters from different department whose presentations were linked to the Local Economic Development Strategy. The Summit acknowledged the fact that the local economy of Makhuduthamaga is highly dependent upon agriculture with vegetables, grains and fruits being the key players followed by retail services, taxi industry and manufacturing. Grain farming is also a major player on a subsistence basis. With the finalized LED Strategy which outlines the role of the municipality and other stakeholders in supporting SMMEs and also clearly identifying various issues and strategic areas for intervention such as indicated below.

The Acting Mayor appraised the Summit as an important achievement and a milestone in the economic development of Makhuduthamaga as it's dubbed the forum where all role players are given a platform to discuss solutions. In reaction to Cllr Mankge' speech delegates commended the municipality for the initiative but raised challenges in accessing sustained funding from other institutions. He concluded in her closing address by expressing hope on the anticipated annual economic growth of the municipality, which heavily rely on meeting all the service delivery budget implementation plans of the Planning and Economic Development department of the municipality.



lectricity post-connections are a permanent feature in the municipal planning cycles because it's an indication that our residents, particularly the youth see no point of starting their families than here in Makhuduthamaga. It is a welcome trend that has positive spin-offs for local economic prospects and growing confidence in the municipality's capacity to bring services closer to the people, and convincing young adults to stay in the settlements around Makhuduthamaga as opposed to going to urban centres where human settlement designs and amenities seem to be attractive.

The municipality has entered into a Service Level Agreement (SLA) with the National Department of Energy for the provision of household connections. other hand pose challenges such as raising demand on the electricity supply grid and duplication of resources in areas where projects were already completed in the previous financial years. In her address to the State of the Municipality Address Mayor Minah Bahula pulled the attention of the community of Makhuduthamaga to the fact that many households can tell with great relief that they are experiencing a better life. And that life has become easier for them after being included in the Eskom electrification project including post connections. Among examples that stand out of the basket is the one of Semahlakole village

where 58 households are sharing this experience and similarly the 170 households in Tisane, 373 households in Manganeng, 195 in Diphagane, 134 in Leeukraal, 74 in MailaMapitsane, 49 Serageng, 183 in Marishane, 179 in Mangamolane/ Malaeneng/Mokgwatsane. "In addition we then supported work done by Eskom. We are in an advanced stage of implementing Municipal Electrification Project in Khayelitsha, Mogaladi village, Masemola Police Station, Thabamphse, Glen Cowie, Marulaneng, Kolokotela, Dichoueng, Molepane, Makoshala, Mogodu, Mamatjekele, Motseleope, Dikaton amongst others." Said Mayor Bahula.

Local authors honoured, recognized ar



In the world where everything in cluding means of acquiring knowledge goes digital, authors and publishers are becoming poorer and less recognised besides the hard work they put behind their craft. Not to mention authors of indigenous languages such as Sepedi which researchers indicate that it's facing decline and further marginalisation as a language used outside the household.

Awakening to this sad reality facing Sepedi language the Mayor of Makhuduthamaga Cllr Minah Bahula made a war cry to save Sepedi language as the most tangible of all cultural inheritances that the Bapedi people have. Despite being the only Mayor in the District, and probably in the whole of Limpopo Province whose municipality publishes each external Newsletter in Sepedi and English equally word for word, pound for pound, Cllr Minah Bahula has ex-

tended her crusade on Sepedi language perseveration and active use to local authors whom she dubbed as the last line of defence for the diminishing language. It is Mayor Bahula's wish to present the lengthy documents such as IDP and Budget Speeches in Sepedi language in the quest to ensure the community genuinely understand the contents of her speeches, not just use her platforms for compliance purposes.

Mayor Bahula has also introduced a widely acclaimed trend of being ushered by the epic ethnic poet 'sereti' in public events that she address, no matter the size and magnitude. In addition to promoting the language the Mayor says it's her effort to get younger generation interested and see prestige in knowing their cultural identity, and taking pride in it. Affectionately known as Mogaleadi a Hlabirwa the Mayor staged the first ever event to honour local authors whom she calls heroes and sheroes of the pen.

According to Mayor Bahula these authors have something in common, they are young, self-started and are committed to keep the indigenous languages alive. At the event held at Talane Sport Ground in Ward 25, Ga-Mashabela on 21 July 2019 Mayor Minah Bahula honoured Mr Rupert Kgathume Makanatleng whose book is titled "Morwa Marokane". Another author given this ultimate honour is Ms Initia Mooswana whose book title is "Ngwedi o apogelwa ke Maru". Initia Mooswana gave a resounding message of support and appreciation to the Mayor on behalf of all authors. "This is the beginning of our journey, a journey less travelled but with giants like Mayor Bahula we hope to see a future where Sepedi will not only



grow as a language of literature and communication but engendered into facilitating commerce, trade, science, entertainment and research" said Ms Mooswana against a wave of ululations.
