MAYOR ENGAGES MASANTENG COMMUNITY ON SERVICE DELIVERY CHALLENGES



he Mayor of Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality (MLM), Cllr. Masekwele Merah Mahlase, accompanied by Head of Corporate Services Cllr. Namudi Moses Matjomane, Head of Budget and Treasury Cllr. Malebo Phala, and Ward Cllr. Jerry Monakedi, met with the Masanteng community on thursday 6 February 2025 to address their concerns regarding service delivery.

One of the primary issues raised by residents was the D4353 road, a 9-kilometer stretch connecting Masanteng and Mogaladi. The community expressed frustration over the road's condition and sought clarity on its future development.


The D4353 road is among ten (10) D-roads and bridges that the Municipality has submitted to the Department of Public Works and Roads for consideration. The Municipality is advocating for these roads to be transferred to its assets register, allowing them to be formally incorporated into the Integrated Development Plan (IDP) and prioritized in budget allocations. The Municipality has already completed detailed designs for more than 10 D-roads within its jurisdiction. The Mayor's Office will continue engaging the provincial department to push for authorization and funding to improve these critical routes. Addressing the Masanteng community, Mayor Mahlase assured residents that the Municipality will begin the process of de-

veloping detailed designs for the D4353 road, just as it has for other D-roads. However, she emphasized that implementation will only be possible once the Department of Public Works and Roads grants official authorization.

The Municipality urges communities to remain patient and engage constructively as leadership continues negotiations with the provincial department. Efforts are ongoing to secure both interim and long-term solutions for the affected roads.

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MAYOR MERAH MAHLASE LEADS EXCO ON SERVICE DELIVERY MONITORING VISITS TO TRANSFORMATIVE MULTI-YEAR PROJECTS

n Monday, 3 February 2025, Her Worship the Mayor, Cllr. Masekwele Merah Mahlase, led the Executive Committee (EXCO) on a site visit to assess progress on key infrastructure projects. In addition to monitoring the Soetveld to Mampana Thabeng access road, the delegation also acknowledged the progress made on Maila Mapitsane to Magolego Tribal Office Access Road, a vital 5km stretch that has reached practical completion. This marks a significant milestone in the municipality's infrastructure development. The road connects to the already completed Maila Mapitsane

Access Road Phase 1, further strengthening regional accessibility and economic opportunities. The completion of this road is expected to significantly ease travel and promote economic activity in the region. Mayor Merah Mahlase, and Executive Committee (EXCO) members Cllr. Sam Malaka, responsible for Infrastructure Development (ID) Department; Cllr. Namudi Matjomane; Cllr. Eric Mosoane; Cllr. Tabane Rankoe; Cllr. Gift Machaba, project managers, and ward councillors visited the construction site of the access road from Soetveld to Mampana Thabeng as part of the Municipality's service de-











visited the construction site of the access road from Soetveld to Mampana Thabeng as part of the Municipality's service delivery monitoring efforts. The Municipality plans to implement five key projects through the MIG grant allocation of R72,858,000 in the current 2024-2025 financial year, comprising two multi-year projects: the access road from Soetveld to Mampana Thabeng (6.5 km) and the Kome internal road (Phase 2)—3.5 km.

The 6.5-kilometre gravel road will be upgraded to a surfaced (asphalt) road with associated stormwater infrastructure, including kerbing, V-drains, portal culverts, drainage structures, road markings, and road signage, as well as other construction elements. The construction work already done on the project involves the installation of culverts, the roadbed layer, the selected layer, and the stabilization of the sub-base layer, and soon the road will be surfaced with an asphalt layer.

The Municipality's EXCO proceeded to another construction site in Ward 31 on the Kome Internal Road, where surfacing is up to 90% done with kerbs and V-drains, and the sub-base layer is currently being finalized with the asphalt surfacing initiated. The Mayor Merah Mahlase expressed

with the development on the Soetveld to Mampana Thabang road and urged the contractor to speed up its implementation and completion, emphasizing the community's eagerness to benefit economically from the project.

With the Maila Mapitsane to Magolego Tribal Office Access Road now practically complete, residents will soon enjoy improved transport connectivity, easing access to essential services and enhancing local economic growth. EMPOWERING THE FUTURE: 58 YOUTH-OWNED BUSINESSES SECURE MAKHUDUTHAMAGAYOUTH FUND SUPPORT, CREATING JOBS











he Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality (MLM), led by Mayor Cllr. Merah Mahlase, has, in partnership with the National Youth Development Agency (NYDA), announced the successful completion and awarding of the Makhuduthamaga Youth Fund (MYF)'s first cohort at the Municipal Chamber in Jane Furse. On Thursday 20 February 2025, the milestone event marked a significant step in supporting youth entrepreneurship and job creation.

The ceremony was addressed by the Executive Mayor of Sekhukhune District Municipality Cllr. Minah Bahula, underlining the need for economic resuscitation through tourism projects and increased support for youth development programs. Since its launch in May 2024, the Makhuduthamaga youth fund's steering committee has received 119 applications via the NYDA's enterprise resource planning (ERP) online portal.

Makhuduthamaga is South Africa's first municipality to create a youth fund in partnership with the NYDA. Both the Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality and the NYDA allocated R 2 million in 2024 to support and fund startups and well-established youth-owned businesses within the Municipality. During the fund's overview presentation, Municipal Manager Mr. Ronald Moganedi announced that the youth fund's steering committee approved 58 out of 119 applicants with an expected expenditure of more than R1.4 million. The fund's recipients include a variety of businesses such as salons, restaurants, car washes, and agricultural products that applied for

Threshold 1 (R 1000 to R10,000) and Threshold 2 (R 10 000 to R 50 000). It is projected that funding this first cohort of businesses will result in 174 jobs being created. The Municipality will soon announce the second round of the fund's application process. The NYDA has committed to transferring an additional R445 000 into the MYF account to help fund the second phase application intake. The available money to commence the second phase will be R1 million.

Makhuthamaga Mayor Cllr. Merah Mahlase congratulated all recipients and encouraged them to grow and position their enterprises as key players in the local economic market, assist the government and other parties in creating more jobs for our communities.

The occasion was graced by the attendance of Member of the Provincial Legislature (MPL) Ms. Faith Sebopela, Member of the Mayoral Committee (MMC) Cllr. Kanana Leokana, Chief Whip Cllr. The Municipality is currently financing 20 students pursuing numerous fields at higher education institutions across the country. Since the beginning of December 2024, the Municipality has introduced a holiday work program to provide bursary beneficiaries with learning opportunities in various departments and units. 9 bursary students are participating in the program till the end of January and will continue during the June study recess.

The MM, Mr. Moganedi, a previous bursary beneficiary who has passionately pushed for the transformation of the bursary policy since his arrival at the Municipality through the Council, told an amazing life story about how the same bursary altered his life for the better.

He further stated "All of you have the capacity to excel in your academic studies and careers because your matric results have already proved your capabilities and distinguished you as the cream of Makhuduthamaga Municipality. With the temptations of varsity, you must remember the situation you left behind at home. Go make your parents and the entire Municipality proud," said Moganedi.

A strong inspiration was given to the group of beneficiaries by Ms. Ntjana Mmaphasoane, a previous bursary recipient and municipality employee who works as a project manager in the Infrastructure Department.

"You have been given a chance to change your life and those around you through the bursary," said Mayor Cllr. Merah Mahlase, who wished the students a successful academic year and encouraged them to work tirelessly to become competent professionals who will eventually serve the municipality's community.





NEW EQUIPMENT AND A NEW MARKET FOR SMME SUPPORT RECIPIENTS



he Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality is making every attempt to stimulate the local economy by providing funding to Small, Medium, and Micro Enterprises (SMMEs) operating within its area of jurisdiction.

Percy Seremi Nkgudi (37) residing in Glen Cowie, outside Jane Furse, is one of the Municipality's SMME support 2025 beneficiaries, managing and owning a local business called P & Sons Branding Company, trading as Lwale Upholstery. Lwale Upholstery was founded in 2018 and operated from a backyard room in Glen Cowie until moving to a new business market space early this year, just days after getting support from Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality.

On February 18, 2025, Nkgudi's business received a new boost when the Municipality delivered a new printing machine known as the Titan-Jet Digital Printer, which is known for its durability, reliability, and high-quality output and is used for printing banners, signage, and large-format marketing outputs such as large-scale graphics. Mr. Nkgudi used to generate roughly R 20,000 per year from his printing business, which he ran out of his backyard room. However, everything is anticipated to bloom. Lwale Upholstery hopes to generate over R50,000 per year in the first two years.

Lwale Upholstery also received a secondment for two temporary support people from the Municipality to assist with administrative and operational responsibilities.

The two temporary assistants are among the Municipality's 20 Local Economic Development (LED) learnership candidates placed in various economic sectors since February 2025 through a partnership with the Local Government Sector Education and Training Authority (LGSETA).

Percy Nkgudi expressed his deep gratitude to the municipality for its unwavering support for local businesses and particularly to young business owners. "Even today it still feels like a dream. When I got a call from the municipality to deliver our new equipment, I was overwhelmed with disbelief, and I couldn't eat the whole day. Nkgudi went on to say that in February, he received a brand new machine that will help him expand his business. "I'm really grateful to the Makhuduthamaga Municipality," stated Nkgudi.

Earlier this year, Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality, led by Mayor Cllr. Merah Mahlase, partnered with the National Youth Development Agency (NYDA) to award funding to 58 Makhuduthamaga Youth Fund (MYF) beneficiaries to help them develop their businesses in various economic sectors. MAKHUDUTHAMAGA COUNCIL REVIEWS INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRESS



he Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality (MLM), during its Ordinary Council Meeting (OCM) on 31 January 2025, took account of the Municipal Infrastructure Grant (MIG) report detailing progress on projects under implementation across the Municipality, and other mid-term performance reports for 2024-2025. The Municipality has registered five key projects for implementation through the MIG grant allocation of R 72,858,000 for the current 2024-2025 financial year, consisting two at the construction phase, two at the design phase, and one at the procurement phase, as reported in Council sitting.

According to the Local Economic Development (LED) report submitted to Council, the Municipality received over 350 land applications in the second quarter, with more than 300 of them being tuck shop applications from different communities. Nine (9) of the applications involve high-impact developments such as a regional mall, filling stations, private hospitals, shopping centres, and four (4) of them are approved. The Municipality's MIG expenditure as of the end of the second quarter (December 2024) was 70%, and this puts the Municipality in a better position to reach 100% spending by the end of the financial year. The Council is expanding the municipal road network through several infrastructure projects that are currently underway. During the Council meeting, the Executive Committee (EXCO) led by Her Worship the Mayor, Cllr.

Masekwele Merah Mahlase, presented the following ongoing projects—as highlighted in the MIG report. (1) Construction of Access Road from Soetveld to Mampana Thabeng—6.5 km, targeted (2nd quarter) up to the sub-base layer, progress

is at 60%. (2) Construction of Kome Internal Road, Phase 2—3.5 km, targeted (2nd quarter) up to the selected layer, progress is at 83%. (3) Construction of Access Road from Brooklyn to Makoshala—6.5 km, project is still at inception (scoping and preliminary work underway). (4) Construction of Cabrieve Internal Road—4.12 km, detailed project designs completed. (5) Procurement of Specialised Waste Vehicles: already a front end loader is purchased, and 4 other waste vehicles are at the procurement phase. Likewise, the Municipality intends to upgrade the following roads using the Equitable Share (ES) grant, with some already being implemented.

(1) Construction of Access Road from Maila Mapitsane to Magolego Tribal Office—5 km, project at practical completion. (2) Construction of Access Road from Molebeledi/ Mamatjekele to Masemola Moshate—5 km, targeted (2nd quarter) up to the appointment of the contractor (site establishment). (3) Construction of Access Road from Mokwete to Molepane, Phase 2—5 km (project on the tender evaluation stage). (4) Construction of Madibong Internal Road—3.2 km, targeted for the development of detailed design by 30 June 2025 (detailed design). (5) Construction of Access Road from Tsopaneng to Moela/ Kgopana, targeted for development of inception design by 30 June. (6) Construction of Access Road from Phaahla/ Mamatjekele to Masehlaneng—18 km, targeted for the development of detailed design by 30 June (detailed design completed). (7) Construction of Access Road from Motor-gate Wonderboom to R579—10 km, targeted for the development of detailed design by 30 June. During the session, the Municipality



Moloi. This project is expected to enhance household electrfication efforts in Jane Furse and surrounding communities. The Municipality is now awaiting Eskom to finalize electrical connections on the newly established 22 KV feeder bay at the Mamatshekele Substation.

Key electrification projects highlighted in the second-quarter performance report include: (1) 550 households in Soetveld equipped with electrical infrastructure up to the MV line (complete, awaiting Eskom activation). (2) 170 households in Mohlarekoma connected up to the MV line (complete, awaiting Eskom activation). (3) 130 households in Leekukraal connected up to the MV line (complete, awaiting Eskom activation). (4) 162 households in Mabintane with installations reaching the site establishment phase (not yet complete). (5) 70 households in Hlalanikahle with installations reaching the site establishment phase (not yet complete). (6) 40 households in Makhutšo with installations in the design phase (awaiting Eskom's approval).

The Municipality remains committed to expanding electricity infrastructure and is actively engaging with Eskom to address power capacity limitations in affected areas. Residents are encouraged to remain patient and continue engaging with municipal leadership as efforts progress.

reported that 87 out of 97 targets were achieved, marking an 89% performance rate for the second quarter. One of the notable milestones was the retention of an Unqualified Audit opinion for the 2023-2024 financial year. Mayor Cllr.
