As at 31 January 2023 Makhuduthamaga Municipal Council has noted and made changes to Supply Chain Management (SCM) policy to enable specific preferential procurement practices and provide certainty to qualifying bidders following preferential procurement regulation 2023, which came into effect on 16 January 2023.

In terms of the new approach, which is in line with section 217 of the constitution, procurement will be handled through a specific preferential procurement policy – separate from Makhuduthamaga 's current SCM policy where 20/10 points is for BBBEE, and new policy set out specific goals where 20/10 preference points is for specific goals.
