Desai Luphondo, a co-accused of notorious Czech fugitive and underworld crime boss Radovan Krejčíř, is making a fresh attempt to quash his conviction and sentence, claiming that he was framed in a plot involving the police.

Luphondo plans to present his new evidence in the Supreme Court of Appeal. He is currently serving 35 years in jail for dealing in drugs, kidnapping and attempted murder.

He was the second accused in the well-documented marathon trial featuring Krejčíř in 2015. Now he is seeking a retrial, claiming that new evidence has emerged that he was framed in a plot hatched by the SA Police Service (SAPS) to nail Krejčíř.

Krejčíř was jailed in 2016 for 35 years for drug dealing, kidnapping and attempted murder. Luphondo has also lodged papers in the Johannesburg High Court seeking to be granted bail pending his appeal.

Although City Press is in possession of the court papers lodged on July 6, the National Prosecuting Authority (NPA) this week said it had not yet seen them.

"We have not received any high court application. There is nothing in the register regarding an application to the high court by Desai Luphondo," said NPA spokesperson Phindi Mjonondwane.

But she confirmed they had received the Supreme Court of Appeal application from Luphondo, adding that the NPA would oppose it. Mjonondwane said no date had yet been set for the hearing.

In his papers in the Johannesburg High Court, Luphondo said he wanted his August 2016 conviction set aside.

Luphondo's application reads: "[It is requested] that the execution of the sentence imposed by honourable Justice [Collin] Lamont on February 23 2016 be suspended, pending the finalisation and exhaustion of all appeal remedies available to the applicant."

"That such release on bail be [granted] pending an application brought to the president of the Supreme Court of Appeal." Since his incarceration six years ago, Luphondo has lodged several appeal applications, but without success.

"The upshot of the said evidence is that I have no doubt my conviction, and consequently my sentence, will be set aside on appeal as there is evidence which points to the fact that the section 204 witnesses in my trial were coached to lie under oath," he writes in his court papers. "They falsely implicated me in the commission of offences."

A section 204 witness is granted indemnity to testify against a co-accused and cannot be arrested later, even if they implicate themselves.

Former police commissioner Riah Phiyega is mentioned in the documents as having been involved in the SAPS plot against Luphondo. Phiyega has denied any involvement. When contacted this week, she vehemently denied any knowledge of witnesses being coached to give false testimony to nail Luphondo and Krejčíř.

"No police commissioner is involved in investigations, and no police commissioner handles dockets. I'm not aware of the plot to nail those people.

"If those people are in prison now, it means the NPA correctly prosecuted them. I know nothing about that matter," she said during a telephone call.

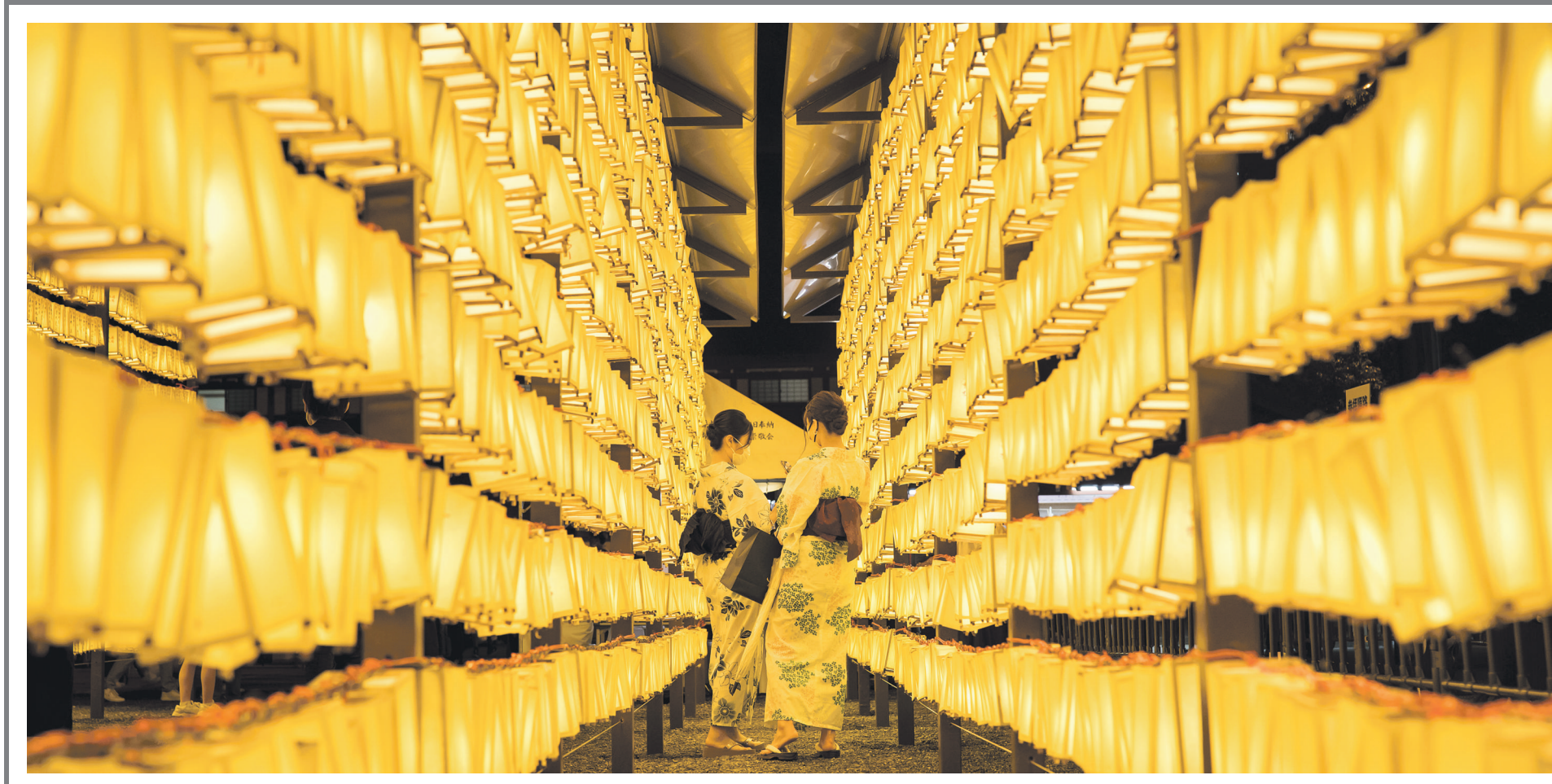
According to Luphondo's new evidence, Peter Msimango, a former SAPS informant, was allegedly used by the Hawks to set a trap to lure Krejčíř into a drug deal.

Krejčíř was handed the drugs valued at more than R25 million. He and Luphondo were later arrested.

Luphondo claims that Msimango was promised a lot of money by the SAPS to give false testimony to put them behind bars. Initially, he was allegedly paid R200 000, but was promised R100 million.

Several attempts by Msimango to secure meetings with the top police officers to discuss his payment allegedly failed.

This angered him, so he decided to blackmail the police by revealing to Luphondo that Msimango's testimony was false and given at the behest of the police, he claims.

Krejčíř sidekick wants a retrial

The recorded confession of a witness granted indemnity from prosecution is the new evidence Desai Luphondo is basing his appeal to overturn his sentence on

Seeing that the police were not budging, Msimango decided to blackmail the SAPS. He contacted Luphondo in prison and "dangled a carrot", telling him that if he wanted to be released, Msimango was willing to reveal that his testimony was false. But Msimango demanded R200 000

from each of the five co-accused in prison who were convicted with Luphondo.

It was then that Luphondo informed the Hawks and a trap was set to record his telephone conversation with Msimango, in which the latter confessed that his testimony was false.

Luphondo is basing his application to have his conviction and sentence overturned on that recording.

Although Msimango admitted to lying in the recorded phone conversation, which the Hawks also have, they cannot arrest him because he has indemnity.
