

Armchair refs and rear-view wisdom **Hanging judge**

once heard people say that the best thing ever invented was the rear-view mirror for one's vehicle. How true that is.

We can all be experts after the fact, especially the armchair refs and so-called experts such as commentators, pundits and journalists.

We can all do things better and differently with the benefit of hindsight. Be that as it may, there is something called planning

and preparing for the unexpected. This takes knowledge, expertise and a sense of

knowing where one wants to go. I have recently been critical of the standard of refereeing and the planning, or lack thereof, for the

onward and upward movement of the game. Recently, I watched a play-off game between Wales and Poland. It was a tough, tense match, as the winner on the night would go through to the Euro finals later

this summer. Yes, that meant a penalty shoot-out, if necessary. With all that was at stake, an experienced and strong

referee was required. This was provided with the appointment of the very experienced European and World Cup referee from

Italy, Daniele Orsato. I have watched this official many times in the past

and he is one of the best in the game. Orsato needed to be that good, because the outcome of the game meant that one team would go through

That meant elation for one and major disappointment for the other.

and the other would go out.

The game did indeed go to a penalty shoot-out, with Poland winning 5-4 when Wales had their fifth penalty saved by Polish keeper Wojciech Szczęsny. It was heartbreak for the home team. This was made worse with the sending off for two

yellow cards of Welsh fullback Chris Mepham in the 120th minute. Why am I mentioning this so forensically? Very

simple. Not many referees, in my opinion, would have taken this action. In fact, I would suggest that only a strong, experienced referee like Orsato would have done it. You may have watched the recent game between

Manchester City and Liverpool, where there was a tackle on Alexis Mac Allister of Liverpool, which went completely unpunished by top English referee Michael

Oliver was no more than 10m away from the incident and looked straight at it, but refused to take any action. This falls into the category of weak refereeing and

Oliver should have been disciplined by his bosses at the Professional Game Match Officials Limited for blatant mishandling of a clear and obvious foul. At worst, it was an indirect free kick for dangerous

play, but he gave nothing. Many have questioned this decision and so did I, in

my show on Monday night. My questions is: If that incident had happened anywhere else on the field outside the penalty area, would the referee have given a free kick - either direct or indirect, as that does not matter? What does matter is that it was a free kick of some sort, but the referee gave nothing.

The real reason, in my opinion, is that it was the 98th minute (that much time had been added on for one reason or another) and there was the possibility of a penalty being awarded to Liverpool.

Did those thoughts run through Oliver's head? It was a home game for Manchester City. The score was 1-1. A possible penalty could have given Liverpool a winner and they could have stretched their lead at the

top of the table. Thoughts like these should never enter a referee's head. He is there to arbitrate between two teams according to the laws of the game - and the winner of a game (or the loser, for that matter) should never be
