"The young generation thinks fame is everything. You'd find a famous singer speaking in an embarrassing manner. That's unfortunate and sad," said Phuzekhemisi.

He said old maskandi artists were also controversial but in matters that encouraged public interest.

"We used to fight against apartheid and other things that violated people's rights. We were not fighting each other," he said.
