COMMUNITY VOICES

HEARD AT IDP

Communities of all the three clusters, Mokuruanyane, Leseding and Ga-Seleka areas submitted valuable inputs during the annual IDP/BUDGET Road show hosted by Lephalale Municipality at Martinique Community hall, Lesedi Tshukudu Thusong Centre and Seleka Community hall on the 6th and 13th of May 2017.

Local Mayor, Councillor Moloko Jack Maeko led a team of Councillors and officials in the road show which was an opportunity for communities to engage on the 2017/18 draft IDP/Budget and submit inputs and suggestions.



As per the Municipal Systems Act (Act 32 of 2000) the IDP must be reviewed annually to ensure its relevance as the Municipality's strategic Plan. One of the key processes to be followed before the adoption of the IDP is proper consultation with affected communities on, amongst other things developmental needs and priorities. It is on this basis that the Municipality conducted an IDP/Budget road show.

The residents of all wards took the opportunity to give inputs of their needs to be considered in the Municipal IDP. They requested for a disability school, Libraries, clinics, schools, parks, sports facilities, High Mast Lights, and intervention to address the loud noise from liquor outlets respectively.

Health Department tackles HIV/AIDS issues

According to statistics released by the Health Department in the Waterberg District, Lephalale has the highest HIV/AIDS prevalence in the District. It is for this reason that the Health Department in the District and the Municipality entered into a partnership and hosted an HIV/AIDS Prevention Campaign “She Conquers” focusing on girls and young women. The campaign was held at Lephalale TVET College on Friday 26 May 2017.

Even though Lephalale is above target in terms of condom distribution, the rapid increase in new HIV/AIDS infection is clearly indicating that the disease is becoming fiercely territorial. In a presentation by the Deputy Director of HIV/AIDS and STI Cluster in the Waterberg District, Tryphina Bambo, 578 new cases of HIV/AIDS infection were recorded from October to December 2016 in Lephalale and a further 583 recorded from January 2017 to March. This means that in the past six months 1161 (one thousand, one hundred and sixty one) people were infected.

MAYOR DELIVERS 2017/18

BUDGET SPEECH

Delivering the 2017/18 Budget Speech in council on Tuesday 30 May 2017, Lephalale Municipality Mayor, Moloko Jack Maeko said that the Municipal budget should show that political leaders of this municipality have surrendered their very being to the people. It should show their commitment to carry the legacy of OR Tambo forward.

“OR Tambo and his generation of compatriots fought and won political liberation for us. We owe our political liberation and democracy to OR Tambo and his generation. They accomplished their mission. Our generation also has a mission to accomplish” the Mayor said.

“As a municipality where a lot of mining activities take place, we must make sure that our local entrepreneurs are developed. In deed we should show commitment in rural development, financial viability, local economic development and job creation, as outlined in our mission statement.”

“I present this budget speech during the week that has been declared as Child Protection Week. We want to take this opportunity and condemn all acts of violence perpetrated against children and women from all over the country.”

“As I presenting our 2017/2018 Draft Annual Budget for 2017/2018 Financial Year, let me start by reminding this house that budget books of our municipality have been improving for the past three financial year; and this was confirmed by the Auditor-General, as he keeps on giving us unqualified audit opinion” he added.

The Mayor said that the Operating Expenditure for 2017/2018 Financial Year is R506,273 million against total Operating Revenue of R461,534 million, which result in the Net Operating deficit of R44,7 million.
